From Pastor Amy



As I write this, we are two weeks away from election day. Anxiety is high as we wonder about the outcomes of the various elections and what our future holds as individuals and as a country.

In as much as we are

citizens of this country, we are first and foremost citizens of the Kingdom of God. As we will affirm and celebrate on November 24. Christ is our King! We look to Jesus to guide all of our decision making, trusting in Jesus promise of abundant life for all of us. As Christians and followers of Jesus, we must allow our faith to inform our vote. Jesus was very clear about the greatest commandment: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your mind, with all your soul, with all your strength. 
Ecumenical Thanksgiving Eve Service Wednesday, November 27 6:30 p.m. St. Paul Lutheran Church

Council Corner

Council met October 8, 2024. The September meeting was cancelled since few members were available to meet.

The Property Team proposed setting up Christmas lights on the bushes along Commercial Street to brighten up a dark area. A lift has been present in the parking lot which was used to work on upper areas of the building outside. On the south side of the basement level, it was noted that all windows need to be replaced due to deterioration. This will be part of the Capital Improvement Project in 2025. The Building Feasibility Team contacted two developers to assess our building.

On November 13 the Discernment Team will be hosting a "Dinner and Conversation" with our neighboring social services entities such as Human Services, Advocap, Community Table, Double Portion, Friendship Place, YMCA, and Youth Go to discuss how we might partner together in the future. These two teams (the Building Feasibility Team and the Discernment Team) will report to the congregation November 17 after worship.

Council also discussed a preliminary draft of the 2025 budget.

Isaac Family Update

"God bless St. Paul Church!" is what Mama Viviane often says as the family celebrates milestones in their new home! For those who aren't familiar with Viviane and the Isaac family, in 2022 St. Paul Church formed a Good Neighbor Team through World Relief, a nonprofit organization that comes alongside refugees and other immigrants as they rebuild their lives in the United States. Our team of 11 individuals, along with the support of the entire congregation, welcomed and supported Mama Viviane, a widow from Congo, and her family of nine children (three young adult and six school-aged children) when they arrived on June 17, 2022 and during their initial resettlement period. We have had the privilege of accompanying this amazing family as they learned a new language, settled into school and jobs and began the process of adjusting to life in a new country.

This summer and fall have brought many reasons to give thanks to God. Babies Jephthe (born to Dorcas and Tresor) and Isaac (born to William and Joyce) are growing and thriving. Daniella graduated from high school this summer and has begun work as a caregiver at an assisted living facility. Mama Viviane, JR and William are all working. The school aged children — Shadrach, LeRoche, Mike, Sifa and Vivi — are involved students at their high school, middle school and elementary schools in Appleton. Recently we had a chance to take them apple and pumpkin picking, and everyone had a great time!

Included are some photos of our Isaac family: Dorcas and baby Jephthe at their home in the Milwaukee area; the proud graduate Daniella and family; and the day at the apple orchards. What a blessing this family continues to be for all of us at St. Paul Church!

Update on the St. Paul Discernment Team

The St. Paul discernment team met for the first time on June 6th, under the guidance and with the facilitation of Cathy Cowling. Members of the team are Audrey Borchers, Mike Dvorachek, Dave Hoks, Lona Jorgensen, and Cindy Rieck. We have met seven additional times since that first meeting as we discern what God is calling us to do and be in this neighborhood and community.

During this ongoing discernment process, we have prayed, read, watched, studied, considered, talked, and listened. We have looked at the demographics of this community. We have identified community partners-others who are providing services in this neighborhood that St. Paul Lutheran Church is a part of. In order to get to know our community better, we have had conversations with these community partners, focusing on their missions, assets, needs and visions. During these conversations, we tried to practice talking less and listening more!

As part of these community conversations, the team met with representatives of a number of businesses and organizations, including the YMCA, Friendship Place, Fox Valley Community Table, YouthGo, Pillars, Double Portion meal ministry, City of Neenah Community Development, Community Clothes Closet, and Shellattés. These revealing conversations deepened our understanding of the good work done in response to needs in our neighborhood. They also opened our eyes to unmet needs and areas that are underserved.

The discernment team, along with Pastor Amy, is inviting our community partners to a Community Partner Dinner Conversation on Wednesday, November 13 at St. Paul. We want to share a meal with potential partners, get to know one another, and talk about ways we can all partner together to better serve those in need in our community. We are looking forward to the conversations that result from this gathering!

We ask that you continue to hold St. Paul Lutheran Church in your prayers as, with the Spirit's guidance, we move forward in discerning what God is calling us to do and be in this neighborhood and community.


