#### **Council Corner**

The Council met on December 10, 2024. A member of the Discernment Team provided an update. A dinner was held at St. Paul on November 13, 2024, with many community partners. Community needs were identified, including two voids that St. Paul may help with: a youth drop-in and a daytime warming shelter. At this time, the Discernment Team will lead an effort to set up a daytime warming shelter at St. Paul. Congregation involvement will be necessary for staffing and interacting with participants. Training will be provided.

The Discernment Team and Building Task Force met together on December 2, 2024. A joint report will be given to the congregation sometime in February 2025.

The mission theme for 2025 is "Blessed to be a Blessing". St. Paul is a blessing in so many ways.

There were some unexpected expenses in November for the boiler, but St. Paul is still operating in the black year-to-date.

The annual congregational meeting is scheduled for January 26, 2025. An informational budget 2025 meeting will be held on January 19, 2025. Both meetings will begin after the church service.

The daytime warming shelter will be open 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. on days when the temperature falls below zero degrees. There will be two shifts of 3-4 volunteers (8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. and 12:30 p.m. -4:30 p.m.). If you would be willing to help staff the daytime warming shelter, please call the church office. Other churches will also be partnering with us. Training will be provided! The discernment team is working with someone who has a great deal of experience working with daytime and overnight shelters as we seek to set up guidelines and protocols that make our daytime warming shelter a safe place to be.
